Dear Parishioners,

I hope you are well.

Please see attached **readings for this Sunday 19th July**, the sixth Sunday after Trinity, with **reflection by Reverend Andrew Down**.

Please also see attached copies of readings from Monday 20th July to Saturday 25th July.

For free phoneline access (free from any landline) **24** hours a day throughout the week for hymns, reflections and prayers, call 0800 804 8044. This 'Daily Hope Phoneline', set up by Archbishop Justin Welby, was initially set up in response to the lockdown but is now **set to continue until further notice**.

BBC Radio 4 (92-95 FM, 103-105 FM) '**Prayer for the Day**', Monday to Saturday from **5.43am to 5.45am** is also **set to continue**: www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b006gmpi/broadcasts/upcoming

At 11am each day, a short reflection called 'Pause and Pray' is broadcast on the Church of England Devon You-tube channel: www.youtube.com/user/CofEDevon/videos These broadcasts were started by the Diocese of Exeter at the start of the lockdown but are currently set to continue.

This **Sunday 19th July** on **BBC Radio 4** (92-95 FM, 103-105 FM), from **5.43am to 5.45am**, **'Bells on Sunday'** comes from the Church of St Michael in Southampton. The church was founded in 1070 and is the oldest building in use in the city. It has ten bells and the back eight bells were cast at the Gillett and Johnston Foundry in Croydon in 1923. The two smallest bells were cast at the John Taylor Foundry in Loughborough in 1947, using metal recovered from the bells of Holy Rood Church which was destroyed in an air raid on November 30th 1940. We hear them ringing Kent Treble Bob Royal: www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b006sgsh/episodes/player As with all broadcasts of 'Bells on Sunday' during the lockdown, this episode was recorded prior to the pandemic. The previous episodes available on the BBC Radio 4 website go right back to 2014 so this is also **set to continue** on Sundays.

Sunday Worship is broadcast each Sunday **On BBC Radio 4** (92-95 FM, 103-105 FM) from **8.10am to 8.58am.** The broadcast this Sunday 19th July is titled '**A word for all Seasons**', Fr. Michael Hall will lead the service to reflect on the way that 'the God who speaks' meets us in all the changing circumstances of our lives. We'll hear passages that have particular emphasis on the importance of the 'Word' of God. You can also listen to this BBC Radio 4 broadcast of Sunday Worship live online or previous episodes at any time by going to this website: www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b006qnds This weekly broadcast is also **set to continue** each Sunday beyond the lockdown.

For our **recommended on-line service this Sunday 19**th **July**, the Diocese of Exeter suggests that we join (on-line) the **Shaldon Benefice and Mission Community** with Reverend Annie Church who will be speaking on '**The Parable of the Weeds**'.
