Reflection by Rev'd Andrew Down

The Queen, Betty, Victoria, Ross, Sam and us...lives lived in glorious technicolour.

Where were you when you heard the news? This is often a key question following such a historic moment as we experienced this week. On the afternoon of 8th September 2022 I was standing by the graveside of Betty Chudley with her family high up in Torbryan churchyard saying words of comital and getting thoroughly drenched in a downpour. Later that evening as the news of the Queen's death was announced I was with Victoria and Ross as they rehearsed for their wedding to be held on 10th September. For Betty and her family and for Ross and Victoria the announcement of the Queen's death will forever be linked with an important moment in their lives.

All our lives are marked by and linked to our beloved Queen. She was the longest serving monarch and the only monarch most of us have known. In this parting her life is writ large and her presence as our Queen, that has affected us without always us realising it, now comes into focus. The many facets and colours of her life that were blended before now are seen in array of wonderful colour.

On the afternoon of the 8th September I shared with those gathered to mark Betty Chudley's passing the many colours of her life as I understood and had experienced them. I spoke of the long length of her life lived in Torbryan, that she was the glue of this community, her insatiable interest in people and their lives and ability to relate to all whatever their background, her love of nature, the farm and her garden, but most of all her insight and care for those she came into contact with. At Victoria and Ross' wedding on Saturday I will reflect back to them what I have gleaned and seen of the colours of their relationship. I wonder what colours of the Queen's life are catching your attention at this time and that you will gaze at as we mark her passing from this world to the next.

As we know well the Queens faith was central to her way of being and acting as she undertook her earthly pilgrimage. Her faith gave the colours of her life such vigour and brightness. Now that she has been called home we celebrate that she is in God's nearer presence and greater light. Next week at St Andrew's in Ipplepen we will be celebrating the baptism of Sam and hearing her declare her faith in Christ. As part of her baptism she will be receiving a lighted candle representing the light of Christ in her life. This light that is the light of all people that the darkness cannot and will not overcome, as our beloved Queen's life has so wonderfully demonstrated.

As you gaze on the colours of the Queen's life do spend a moment to recognise how they are linked to the colours of your own life and be encouraged to nurture and live the light you have been given so your life, like hers, can be lived in glorious technicolour.
