PALM SUNDAY; Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. A day of action, a day of drama.

This beautiful fresco - painted by Giotto - forms part of a cycle of paintings in the Scrovegni Chapel in Padua. Painted between 1302 and 1305 it tells the story of Christ's birth, life and resurrection at a time when few people could read. Here we see Jesus about to enter Jerusalem by the Golden Gate. He is being welcomed by citizens pouring out of the gate to greet him.

What were these people thinking about what they saw; what was their reaction to it?

THE DISCIPLE IN RED AND GREEN - thinking quietly to himself; 'It was weird this morning when the master sent us off to find that donkey it was almost as if he knew what was going to happen and the owner didn't seem too bothered when we took the donkey and its colt. THE PERSON UNDER THE GREEN CLOAK ON THE RIGHT.

'This is abit embaressing, I ca't get my cloak off over my head. Not sure why I am takingit off anyway, I don't really want to throw it on the ground in front of the donkey, like everyone else is doing. t's my best one, new and expensive. Fit for a king.
