**Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April: National Mobile Phone Emergency Alert Test.** The Government has announced that on St George's Day (Sunday 23 April) there will be a national test of a new emergency alert system. We do not know what time the test will be, but it may happen during a church service, so it is worth being ready for it. During the test your mobile phone or tablet may:

- make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent
- vibrate
- read out the alert

The sound and vibration will last for about 10 seconds. The alert will include a phone number or a link to the GOV.UK website for more information.

# Reflection by Rev'd Anne Burden



Second Sunday of Easter 16<sup>th</sup> April 2023

I'm sure that those of you who were able to come to our worship at St Andrews (and of course similarly at the other Churches) on Easter Day will agree that the Church looked magnificent - in her 'Easter glory' - with flowers, candles, music and festive vestments. My favourite part of the decoration is always the Floral Easter Cross, which members of the congregation complete by adding a flower when they arrive in Church - a beautiful springtime creation representing the joy of resurrection.

Easter is a time of renewal - new life - and after the tough days of Lent when decoration in Church is pared back and many people struggle as they try to grow in their faith and come closer to God - there is a sense of relief and hope and joy. We are reminded that Jesus who died on the cross on Good Friday lives again, not just at a particular time in history - but now - and that new life is for us all, not just all those years ago - but now. Resurrection with a large "R" is what happened then - the event from the past which we read about in the Bible - but resurrection with a small "r" is God's gift to us today, always and forever.

When Jesus rose from the dead it wasn't as if the clock was being turned back and he was returning to exactly how he had been before looking and acting the same. That would have been a miracle, for sure - but might have more properly been called 'resuscitation'. 'Resurrection' is something much bigger than that. It is about the

process of transformation of earthbound life to a spirit-filled life - life which lasts forever. And that is God's Easter promise to us. That God will fill us with his life and light so that our frail human lives will be transformed little by little into his likeness, and overflow with his love.

This is why I find the Floral Cross such an important symbol at Easter. It is a cross transformed. It doesn't appear - bright and beautiful - from nothing. It starts plain and empty and bare - and becomes transformed by the coming together of God's people - all playing their little part with just one flower - and with God's power and grace, creating a whole.

So, as you think about Easter and what it has meant to you this year, think about resurrection and new life - and take some time to think about transformation, your transformation towards the person God really wants you to be. This is your resurrection (with a small "r") - God's gift to you - not just in the Easter season, but always.

So Easter Greetings - and many happy new resurrections.
