# Reflection by Krzysztof (Chris) Ramus

Trinity Sunday 4th June 2023

### **HOLY TRINITY**

And Jesus came to them and spoke to them, saying: "All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth. Go, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I commanded you. Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age". Amen

Matthew 28:18-20

On Trinity Sunday we confess our faith in one God in Holy Trinity. We worship Holy Trinity in Unity, neither confounding the Persons, nor dividing the Essence. For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son, and another of the Holy Ghost.

Coming over to the New Testament at the very end of Matthew 28, Jesus is giving his disciples the Great Commission. He commands them to baptise people in the Name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The word Name is singular and then three names are given. How can three be in one name and three persons? Something very strange and special is going on here.

The early Christians were just like us. They believed in One God. Most of them were Jews. And yet they knew Jesus Christ was very special. So much so that they called Him "My Lord and My God". And then the day of Pentecost came, and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. They

never referred to the Holy Spirit as an influence or an "it". He was always a person.

So now they had three persons that they worshipped and called God. By the time one generation of Christians had lived, they were all blessing each other with this benediction: "Now may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all now and forever more. Amen".

The Trinity is a mystery. It cannot be explained by human and finite minds. If God is God, high and mighty above us, we cannot know all about Him. There is always something we cannot know about Him, because God is greater than we are. Nobody but God can know the mind of God. The important fact to know here is that all of God is involved in everything God does. God works in Trinity. The three basic things God does are creation, salvation and reconciliation or redemption, and renewal and transformation. We usually associate creation with God the Father, salvation and reconciliation with God the Son, and renewal and transformation with God the Holy Spirit. But what we want to see today, that there is a unity in the things that God does. All of God is involved in everything God does. All of God, Father, Son and Holy Ghost is involved in creation, salvation and reconciliation, and in our renewal and transformation. We cannot separate what God does. What one person wills and does, the other two also will and do.

The three persons of Holy Trinity are united in a loving relationship. God is unchangeable, immutable from the beginning to the end of the world.

GLORY BE TO THE FATHER, AND TO THE SON, AND TO THE HOLY GHOST. AS IT WAS IN THE BEGINNING, IS NOW, AND EVER SHALL BE, WORLD WITHOUT END. AMEN
