THE PAINTING;

Paintings of the Ascencion are comparatively rare. Maybe it is difficult to visualize. It is more of a spiritual happening than a historical event.

There are a few paintings of Christ's feet disappearing into clouds, but they seem rather unconvincing.

(How would you depict the event !?) This one has more structure to it. It's painted by Andrea Mantegna (c1431-1506).

He lived and worked in renaissance Italy. Christ is gently born upwards surrounded by a group of 'putti'. His left hand is raised in a blessing and an almost farewell wave to the disciples below. His right hand holds a flag, reminiscent of a Bishop's crook.?

Florence.

PENTECOST - The Coming of the Holy Spirit.

This one is a finial on the cover on the Font in Exeter Cathedral. It's carved in wood and was made for the baptism of Charles I daughter in 1644.
